1. The minutes of the meeting of January 17, 1951, having been mailed out, were approved without being read.
2. THE BOARD VOTED to accept the following resignations:

4. THE BOARD VOTED to accept and place on file the following requests for leave of absence:

5. THE BOARD VOTED to accept the following scholarships and gifts and instructed the President to write appropriate letters of appreciation:
- (1) Grant of \$3000 from the American Cancer Society, Inc. in support of research program under the direction of W. Landauer.
 - (2) Grant of \$5000 from Research Corporation in support of Dr. Lippincott's project "Structure of Polyatomic Molecules as determined from Raman and infrared spectra."
 - (3) \$2500 to Poultry Department of Agricultural Experiment Station from the E. I. DuPont de Nemours & Co. for the study of synthetic amino acids in poultry rations.
 - (4) Gift of twelve sheets of 1901 Geological Map of New York State from Dr. John Fanshawe to the Department of Geology.
 - (5) Gift of two water color paintings from Ethel Garbus of Hartford.
 - (6) Gift of equipment from New Britain Machine Co. to Mechanical Engineering Department.
 - (7) Gift of sculpture from Seamless Rubber Company to College of Pharmacy.

- (8) Gift of intercommunication system from Tracht and Roche, Palmer, Massachusetts to Animal Diseases Department.
 - (9) Gift of Aircraft Turbo Supercharger and blower half of a similar unit from Instructor Wendell Davis to Department of Mechanical Engineering.
 - (10) Mediator Scholarship increased by \$50.00 per year.
 - (11) Four scholarships of \$100 each from Parent-Teacher Association of Connecticut.
6. THE BOARD VOTED to approve the following transfers in accounts:
- (1) Allotment of \$100,000 from College of Law fund account 5.78 to Construction of Pharmacy building project account 8.388. This sum is needed to finance the purchase of equipment for the new College of Pharmacy building.
 - (2) The Public Works Department has informed me that approximately \$6,000 more will be needed to finance the grading, seeding and planting of the Faculty Apartment area. Therefore, approval is requested for the transfer of \$6,000 from account 8.322 to account 8.343.
7. The President presented the retirement status of Mrs. Mabel Leigh who will reach the age of 65 in April. The President indicated that he was requesting Mr. Riccio to do what he could within the framework of the State Merit System to continue her employment in her present position, at least, until a suitable replacement was secured for maid.
8. The President presented to the Board the request from the Mansfield Nursery and Kindergarten Cooperative for the use of one of the temporary buildings on South Campus for nursery and kindergarten instruction. THE BOARD VOTED to approve the President's recommendation that Building No. 19 or Building No. 20 be assigned on a temporary no-rent basis with the understanding that a necessary agreement would meet all questions with reference to liability, termination of use, and related questions.
9. The President presented to the Board a request from the State Supervisor of Purchases for the loan of twenty tablet armchairs to the Veterans Home and Hospital at Rocky Hill, Connecticut. The President recommended that the University not loan the tablet armchairs for two reasons --one, that considerable surplus equipment of this kind moved from Fort Trumbull may be claimed by the Division of General Services of the Federal government for distribution to training facilities to be operated by the Federal Government; and two, that the University has now been assigned between 600 and 700 Army Air Force officers for specialized training. Whatever equipment, including tablet armchairs, is now located at South Campus will need to be retained for this program.
10. The President reported on his appearance before the Appropriations Committee for the purpose of reviewing the annual recurring budget needs of the University. The major emphasis made by the President at the hearing was pointed up by a letter of February 21, 1951 addressed to the Governor, copies of which were sent to the members of the Appropriations Committee.

This communication was approved by the sub-committee of the Board on the budget and was concerned with "appropriations recommended in the executive budget for operating expenses at the University of Connecticut." The Board indicated its approval of the recommendations made by the sub-committee and the adjusted needs as pointed up in this communication and presented to the Appropriations Committee.

11. The President reviewed the bills to be heard before the Finance Committee on Wednesday, March 28, 1951. The Board indicated approval of the following bills to be urged at the hearing:

- 1) S.B. 225 - Self-liquidating Bonds - Faculty Housing.
- 2) S.B. 226 - Self-liquidating Bonds - Field House.
- 3) S.B. 227 - State Bonds - To complete and equip construction now under way.
- 4) S.B. 228 - Self-liquidating Bonds - Student Housing.

12. The President discussed the two bills calling for appropriations:

- 1) To finance the improvement of the North Eagleville Road by the State Highway Department, and
- 2) To finance the improvement of campus roads by the State Highway Department.

The President recommended that if a meeting to be held with Commissioner Hill within the next ten days proved helpful, it may be wise to withdraw these two bills. THE BOARD VOTED its approval of the recommendation.

13. The President discussed the delays in releasing plans for

- 1) The Auditorium, to be financed out of self-liquidating bonds.
- 2) The Stadium and related facilities, to be financed out of self-liquidating bonds, and
- 3) The addition to the Law School building, to be financed out of law funds and to meet accreditation requirements.

The Board expressed grave concern regarding these delays and urged that the Governor be contacted to resolve such misunderstandings as may exist regarding these projects, in order that the construction of these facilities can be gotten under way at the earliest possible moment.

14. The President reported on his visit to Washington as a delegate to discuss "acceleration of college instruction." The President indicated his disapproval of accelerating college programs at this time. If acceleration were to be adopted for all colleges and universities, it would require an increase in the teaching parts of the University budget of one-third, in order to finance three semesters during each fiscal year.

15. The President reported on his trip to Washington to resolve a problem which has arisen regarding the transfer of title of Fort Trumbull educational equipment to the University. Senator McMahon's office is assisting in resolving the problem and the President hopes to present a favorable action on this matter at the next meeting.
16. The President presented the matter of Occupancy Insurance on University dormitories. The President indicated that the matter was being carefully studied. THE BOARD VOTED to approve the discontinuance of Occupancy Insurance if the results of the survey so indicated.
17. The President presented the case of a student whose parent objects to the University requirement that all students be vaccinated for smallpox. THE BOARD VOTED to reaffirm its position on vaccination as a measure to protect the health of all students, but VOTED to make an exception in the case of Miss Glenda Joy Lindholm if exception needed to be made on strictly medical grounds.
18. The President advised the Board that two national fraternities had written requesting "that the Board of Trustees consider extending the time limit previously set for removing the discriminatory clauses from constitutions of national fraternities." September 1951 was the time limit set by Board action on May 17, 1950. THE BOARD VOTED to request the President to write these two fraternities to inquire when they expect their national organizations will take appropriate action on this matter.
19. THE BOARD VOTED to approve the recommendations for promotion and tenure of professional staff members as approved by the appropriate Department Head and Dean, and the Provost and the President:
